## IT UP TO TALENT

If it's true that "the world is just a canvas of the imagination," then with its miles of picturesque pavement and snazzy sidewalks, the Clearwater Beach Chalk Art Festival takes the phrase quite literally.

As did PCSO Graphic Designer Tracey Welch when she developed the concept that won her the 2015 Chalk Art Festival poster contest.
